CHAPTER 93

DRUGS

MARIJUANA-PENALTY FOR GROWING, SALE OR GIFT .

(S. B. No. 409, by Senators Talbot, Lininger, Horn and Quiat)

AN ACT

PROHIBITING THE PRODUCTION, MANUFACTURE, SALE, GIFT, USE OR POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA, AND PRO-VIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ACT.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. That Section 3 of Chapter 95 of the Session Laws of Colorado for the year 1927, be and Section Amended the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 3. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Act shall upon a first conviction be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and punished by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and upon a second or subsequent conviction of a violation of any of the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a felony and shall be punished by imprisonment in the state penitentiary for not less than one year nor more than five years.
